
 Books, Journals and educational resources make people think things

Belonging vs Bowling Alone

- The IRS recognized 66,985 trade and professional associations in 2013
 - That number is decreasing

- 57 million adults in America take formal work-related courses or training each year, and more than 69 percent of those individuals receive those training programs from either a private business or a professional association
 - This number is increasing



Bowling Alone: America's Declining Social Capital

Social capital is a form of economic and cultural capital in which social networks are central, transactions are marked by reciprocity, trust, and cooperation. and market agents produce goods and services that have intrinsic and extrinsic value.

- Association vs Association (AMA vs AOA)-Competitors?
 - Compete for meeting attendance, publication readership
 - More competition from meetings unlinked to associations, or online information
 - Gatekeeper of Professional Information
 - Doing a lousy job of having a standard for information sharing

The Echo Chamber effect on Safety

- Social learning improves decision making only when individuals each have different information or skills
 - Is there pressure to come to the same conclusion by all
 - Another drug seeker to be seen
 - Status hystericus
 - Is there such a thing as systemic exertion intolerance syndrome (fibromyalgia)
 - Dependence between people

Echo Chamber

- Microstrategies
 - Decision making within a group
 - Deciding between known/tried strategies

- Macrostrategies
 - Social Exploration

- opportunities for social learning (which usually involve informal face-to-face interactions among employees) is often the largest single factor in company productivity.


What Does Organized Medicine Contribute to the Healthcare System


